How Can You Help?

We are looking for infants, children, adolescents, and adults with a diagnosed Autism Spectrum Disorder or an intellectual disability,, as well as their siblings, to participate in some of our studies.

What is Involved?

FOR ADOLESCENTS AND ADULTS:

Most of our studies involve one to two hour long visits to our centre. Once here, you will participate in a series of tasks that may involve answer questions, watching an actor or a video, or participating in hands-on activities.

FOR CHILDREN:

Most of our studies involve one to two hour long visits to our child-friendly centre. Once here, your child will participate in a series of fun, age appropriate play-like tasks with our staff. You are able and welcome to be with your child at all times during your visit. Siblings are more than welcome! We have toys, games and friendly staff to play with your children.
